

# COST Action CA19131 Action Title: Europe Through Textiles: Network for an integrated and interdisciplinary Humanities

### Minutes of the Management Committee Meeting hosted online from the 138 Pireos Benaki Museum, Athina 118 54, Greece on October 21<sup>st</sup> 2022, 17:00–18:30 (EEST)

1. Welcome to participants, verification of the quorum and adoption of agenda

The Action Chair, Agata Ulanowska, opened the proceedings, greeted all participants both in Athens and online. A quorum verification followed, in which the presence of the following countries was duly noted:

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A total of 17 countries attended, so the necessary quorum for votes (21 countries) was not reached. MC and Core Group members were duly informed that decisions would have to be taken later by e-vote.

No objections were raised against the proposed agenda for the meeting, so it was considered adopted.

### 2. Information to the MC

 Recap of the minutes of the last meeting, e-votes and matters arising since the last meeting

The MC and Core Group members made no remarks about the minutes of the last meeting, so they were approved.

The Action Chair offered a rundown of all the e-votes arising from the lack of quorum in the previous MC Meeting. MC Members offered no additional remarks on this topic.

The MC was also informed of the nomination of a new delegate for Italy, P. M. Militello, briefly introduced by the Action Chair.

b) Core Group: report from the Core Group, including delegated decisions and progress report of the Working Groups and the Digital Atlas and Anthology teams

The Action Chair informed the attending delegates and Core Group members that a detailed scientific mid-term report on the Action's progress was prepared for the Ancient Textiles Review journal before the meeting, and that said report will be published until the end of the year.



### Given that:

- this report covers all the relevant information about the progress made by the different Working Groups and the Digital Atlas and Anthology teams;
- that some of the WG and team representatives were absent due to force majeure reasons;
- and that the meeting does not have the required quorum,

it was proposed and accepted to skip the reports from the Core Group.

c) Action Membership: New Specific Organisations and COST Members represented in the MC

Nothing to report on this point of the agenda.

d) Action Participation: WG membership and applications, New MC members/Observers and provisional substitution

The Action Chair recalled the MC and Core Group members of the new formalities arising from the transition from Horizon 2020 to Horizon Europe and of the ongoing process by which members must apply to be part of the Working Groups. The importance of this process was stressed, as Working Group membership numbers now carries implications for the calculation of the budget to be allocated to the Action by COST.

It was noted that, as the approval of new applications was delegated by the MC on the Core Group, said applications are being processed on a monthly basis, with a total of 159 members having already been voted into the Working Groups.

New applications are being submitted continuously – even some during the VIII Purpureae Vestes International Symposium in Athens. Some applications were due to be voted during the present Core Group meeting, namely from the following applicants:

Due to the lack of quorum, these applications, as well as others arising in the meantime, will be submitted to an e-vote by Core Group members.



### e) Budget status: summary from the Grant Holder, Action Grants

The Action Chair introduced the new Grant Holder manager, Iwona Zielińska, who attended the online meeting and greeted the participants.

The Action Chair also apologised for the delays with payments, expressing her wish that claims would be processed more smoothly in the following Grant Period. The meeting participants were reminded that, in order to achieve this, the reimbursed participants have to submit their claims as soon as possible after the events.

In order to ensure this is the case, the Action Chair proposed a new procedure setting a time frame of no more than 14 days for participants to submit their claims, after which the claims and payments for each specific event will be processed. This procedure will be submitted to a specific vote.

Regarding the **current budget status (AC presentation: slides 5–8)**, the Action Chair informed the meeting participants that there were some leftover funds from the current Grant Period budget. Problems with budget estimations were also addressed, namely those arising from updates in the daily allowance rates during the Grant Period and the unpredictable and raising costs of flights.

Despite this, the financial report for the second Grant Period has been submitted and is currently being processed. However, some operations are still pending, namely the payment of the last batch of grants awarded by the Action, the claims from the VIII Purpureae Vestes International Symposium, and an invoice for the Digital Atlas and the maintenance of the website.

Regarding the expenditures which have already been reported, the Action Chair noted that the budget execution regarding Meetings (slide 5), although the final costs arising from the VIII Purpureae Vestes International Symposium are still to be determined. Regarding Training Schools, and following two very successful Training Schools in Person during the second Grant Period (slide 6), the allocated budget was exceeded. This, however, can be covered by the surplus from other areas of the budget.

With regard to Calls and Open Calls, the Action Chair reported that the Grant Awarding Committee offered, altogether, four Dissemination Conference Grants (all of them for the organization of sessions at the 28<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting of the European Association of Archaeologists), one Short Term Scientific Mission, two ITC Conference Grants and five Virtual Mobility Grants (slide 7).

The Head of the Grant Awarding Committee, Riina Rammo, had not further comments to add on this matter.

Regarding the third Grant Period, the Action Chair mentioned that the Action would like to encourage more participants to apply for Grants, but that the Grant offer in the next Grand Period will be limited, as the budget will be reduced, and an option has been made to focus resources on in person meetings.

Participants were informed that a call for grants would open shortly after the next Work and Budget Plan agreement was in effect, with a second call being scheduled for later in the Grant Period, in June.

The Action Chair informed the participants of the meeting that, with regard to dissemination, many of the activities planned for the second Grant Period, especially publications, could not be accomplished on time (slide 8). This can be attributed to the overload of work members are subjected too, and the non-executed budget can be used to cover the over-expenditure with Training Schools. However, publications should be strongly prioritized in the forthcoming Grant Period.



Next, the Action Chair introduced the National Survey of the European Textile, Dress and Fashion Sectors. A preliminary version of the Survey, with design and typesetting by Paula Nabais (PT), has recently been made available online.

At this point, Paula Nabais (PT) took the floor to present the Survey. She noted it is not yet finished, as the introduction is still in preparation, and that she is working on bettering the visualization of the data compiled through the survey. She will soon be able to present graphics which will allow for a quick comparison between the different countries represented in the survey

She went on to note that the fact sheets from some countries are still missing, namely the following:

- Albania, Croatia, Hungary, Ireland, Latvia, the Netherlands, Serbia, and Sweden.

At this point, Anique Hamelink, from the Netherlands, mentioned she was not aware of the Survey and would, if she could, compile the fact sheet for her country as soon as possible.

The Action Chair gave the floor to Alina lancu next for an update on the EuroWeb Digital Atlas of European Textile Heritage. She reported that the design of the Atlas is complete, and that the team is now working on the frontend of this platform, preparing the user interface. The Atlas is however ready to begin receiving data from members.

Alina lancu presented a survey which was recently launched to understand the volume and type of data members expect to input into the Atlas, noting than in the short time this survey has been open a large number of replies (45+ from 25 countries) have been received. Responses have been noted from Estonia, North Macedonia, Switzerland, Spain, United Kingdom, Malta, Czechia, Ireland, Turkey, Austria, Slovakia, Serbia, Finland, Iceland, Denmark, Portugal, Lithuania, Greece, Poland, Italy, Albania, Hungary, and Tunisia. She expressed the wish of the team to start working directly with members to start inputting data into the Atlas in the next few weeks. Online publication of the Atlas is aimed in May 2023.

f) Update from the COST Association (if representative is present)

No COST Association representative was present during the meeting.

- 3. Follow up and discussion on the...
  - a) Action management: structure, leadership positions and other supporting roles

Regarding this point of the agenda, the Action Chair noted that with the new Horizon Europe framework, changes to the previously inactive Working Groups 5 and 6 were required, updating their designation and their leaders.

In the new framework, the Action now has a Grant Awarding Coordinator (Riina Rammo, EE) who is in charge of Grants and Short Term Scientific Missions, which are now considered grants too.

On the other hand, EuroWeb now has a very developed network for Communication, which however has developed independently from the Short Term Scientific Missions.



For this reason, it was proposed that these Working Groups are restructured as following:

- Working Group 5: Internal and External Communication, to be led by the Science Communication Coordinator, F. B. Gomes;
- Working Group 6: Management, Grants and Training, to be led by the Head of the Grant Awarding Committee, R. Rammo (with C. Michel, of the same Committee, as vice-leader).

There were no questions from the meeting participants at this point.

Due to the lack of quorum, these organic changes will be submitted to an e-vote.

b) Implementation of the COST Excellence and Inclusiveness Policy

Regarding the Implementation of the COST E&I Policy, the Action Chair indicated that the Action aims at benefitting more from the ITC research environment and at integrating ITC participants in person meetings and promoting young researchers – these aims are to be promoted by upcoming grants.

The Action Chair also reported on a mentoring programme implemented this year within EuroWeb, with Mary Harlow (UK) and Susanne Lervad (DK) as mentors. Zofia Kaczmarek (PL), Jenni Sahramaa (FI), Ieva Pigozne (LV) and Klara Dankova (IT) successfully applied to this programme.

Exclusion based on the language was supposed to be one of the main topics for this Grant Period; not enough progress has been made on this topic and further focus on the forthcoming Grant Period.

At this point, Anique Hamelink intervened to suggest that one way to foster language inclusion would be to adopt the use of bilingual PowerPoints as best practice during Action events.

c) Science Communication Plan

Regarding the Science Communication Plan, the Science Communication Coordinator, F. B. Gomes, informed the meeting participants that this document is currently being prepared and should be submitted to the consideration of the MC and Core Group members in the next few weeks. The current progress in dissemination in communication is presented in the attached presentation of the Science and Communication Manager (slides 1–6).

d) Progress on MoU Objectives, WG tasks, deliverables, and Goals for the current GP

The Action Chair reminded the participants of the general goals of the Action and the specific goals for the second Grant Period (slides 11–12), most of which have been accomplished, while others will remain in focus during the following Grant Period.

### 4. Planning

a) Work and Budget Plan for the next Grant Period and Upcoming activities



The Action Chair informed the meeting participants that the Work and Budget Plan for the third Grant Period has been accepted both by COST and by the MC in an e-vote, and the agreement for the next Grant Period is now being processed.

The main goals of the third Grant Period were outlined by the Action Chair, and are as follows:

- To focus on dissemination of the EuroWeb results via Open access text publications and the publication online of the current version of the Digital Atlas:
- To strengthen multidisciplinarity of networking and to target it towards the EuroWeb objectives and deliverables through in-person meetings;
- To develop further training schemes and workshop activities in order to promote and mentor young researchers and innovators and ITC participants;
- To develop further schemes for communication of the EuroWeb results and communication with the EuroWeb stakeholders:
- To continue monitoring, diagnosing, and ensuring gender balance and inclusiveness among the EuroWeb members.

The Action Chair than proceeded to offer an overview of the events and dissemination activities which are scheduled to take place in the next Grant Period (slides 13–16).

Regarding Meetings, the Work Plan included a Digital Atlas 'hackathon' to be held in Vienna (AT), the International EuroWeb Conference "Interwoven Societies", in Lübeck (DE), the "Textiles and War Conference" in Bucharest (RO), the "Textiles and the Body" Workshop, in Lisbon (PT), and the "Traditional Textiles in Central and Eastern Europe" in Baita (RO).

It was also mentioned that the next MC meeting will be held in digital form during the Lübeck Conference, with another in-person meeting scheduled to take place during the Bucharest Conference.

As for Training Schools, two are already scheduled for the third Grant Period: one on the microscopic analysis of excavated textiles and use-wear marks on textile tools using Dino-Lite microscope (on-line), and one on hands-on approaches to textile tools, documentation, functionality, and use-wear with textile tools from Bronze Age Malia, Crete as a case study, in Malia (EL)).

At this point, Tereza Štolcová (SK) posed the question of whether the Dino-Lite training would be held entirely on-line, to which the Action Chair replied in the positive.

Moving on to the expected grants for the next Grant Period, the Action Chair informed the participants that the Action expects to award three Short Term Scientific Missions, two ITC Conference Grants and 2 Dissemination Conference Grants during the third Grant Period.

The Action Chair further called the attention of the participants to a major upcoming international textile conference – the CIETA Congress, to be held in Kraków in October 2023.

For the future, the Action Chair noted that the Action's strategy would be to concentrate all inperson meetings during the first part of the Grant Period, to be able to recalculate the budget if necessary and add Virtual Mobility Grants to the roster of Grants to be awarded during the second half of the Grant Period in case there is any surplus budget.



### 5. Monitoring and Reporting to the COST Association

The Action Chair noted that she is currently preparing a Progress Report required by COST at the mid-term of the Action. It was noted that, although it is still premature to discuss specific problems potentially endangering the achievement of the objectives of the Action, publications are an issue on which the team must definitely focus on during the next two years.

It was also pointed out that the Action and its members should be more active in participating in non-Action meetings, especially in contexts such as EU Parliament activities, meetings with policy makers, experts in the broader textile field, regional authorities, etc. One step in this direction was taken with the participation during this Grant Period in the Festival of the New European Bauhaus (see below).

### 6. AOB

At this point, the Science Communication Coordinator, F. B. Gomes, took the floor to report on the Action's participation in the Festival of the New European Bauhaus (SCM presentation: slides 7–8), noting that during the three days of the Festival, EuroWeb's stand, manned by Paula Nabais, Alina lancu, and himself, had received 200 visitors, including textile experts, craftspeople, but also policy makers and funding agency representatives.

It was reported that one of the main ideas arising from this event was to try and set up, towards the end of the Action, a meeting – possibly a COST event – to bring together textile researchers in the Humanities and in other fields, such as Material Sciences (e.g., smart textile experts), and policy makers to map points of contact and come up with eventual policy suggestions regarding sustainability and the future of the textile industry.

F. B. Gomes also reported on the state of the Action's communication channels, noting the progress made and the growth in the reach of the channels. It was noted that the break in online activities meant a reduction in the content produced for YouTube, and that measures will need to take place to keep the channel active. It was proposed that a survey of media content relating to traditional and historical textile crafts across Europe, discussed in the previous MC meeting, should be operationalized in the upcoming Grant Period.

Regarding dissemination activities, F. B. Gomes noted that the Call for Sessions for the 29<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting of the European Association of Archaeologists is now open, and this could be a good opportunity to once again make sure that textile research in general, and EuroWeb in particular, are represented in this broad-spectrum archaeological gathering.

Finally, at the request of the Action Chair, F. B. Gomes also presented the new *Open Research Europe* platform created by the European Commission. This platform, originally intended to facilitate the publication of Open Access peer reviewed content by Horizon 2020/Europe funded projects is also now open to COST Action members, and could be a viable option for the publication of papers by EuroWeb members in the next two years.

The Action Chair opened the floor to any other members wishing to add any point of order, but no one asked to intervene.



### 7. Summary of MC decisions

Due to the lack of quorum, no binding decisions were made at this MC Meeting. A series of evotes will follow on any issues and decisions requiring MC approval.

### 8. Closing

As there was no further business, the Action Chair thanked the participants for their presence and closed the meeting at 18:10h EEST.
