MINUTES

1. Welcome to participants, verification of the quorum and adoption of agenda

Greeting words from the Action Chair (AC), Agata Ulanowska, including a reminder on the launch of the Digital Atlas of European Textile Heritage and an invitation for all members to visit and contribute to this platform.

Verification of the quorum:

On-line – Austria [AT], Czechia [CZ], Estonia [EE], France [FR], Germany [DE], Hungary [HU], Iceland [IS], Ireland [IE], Italy [IT], Latvia [LV], Lithuania [LT], Malta [MT], Norway [NO], Portugal [PT], Slovakia [SK], Sweden [SE], Switzerland [CH]

20 countries were represented; the minimum quorum of 21 countries was not reached, meaning that the MC decisions will be deferred to e-votes after the MC Meeting.

2. Information to the MC

- a) Recap of the minutes of the last meeting, e-votes and matters arising since the last meeting

The last MC Meeting took place online on March 23rd – the minutes are, as usual, published online. There were 2 e-votes for reduced allowances for the “Textiles and the Body” workshop in Lisbon (PT) and for the “Textiles and War” conference in Bucharest (RO, slide 2 of the Action Chair presentation).

- b) Core Group: report from the Core Group, including delegated decisions

The AC summarised the delegates decisions taken by the Core Group (CG) since the last MC Meeting, namely:

- the approval of the list of participants for the workshop in Lisbon and the conference + MC Meeting in Bucharest;



- No WG applications were voted in April – these were reserved for the MC Meeting, and will now have to be submitted to an e-vote due to lack of quorum.;
- The Core Group was very active and there are several ideas for new activities, which were discussed later in the meeting.

c) Action Participation: WG membership and applications

The AC presented the six pending applications for the WGs (slide 3), from:

- 1) Duygu GAZIOGLU RUZGAR - Bursa Technical University - Turkey (TR). She is a textile engineer working with biopolymers, nanofibers, and other novel materials, interested to contribute to clothing terminologies, interdisciplinary solutions for novel materials, has experience in project management);
- 2) Nuray Bayar Muluk - Kırıkkale University, Faculty of Medicine - Turkey (TR). She is a Professor, Otorhinolaryngology Department. She wants to follow and learn the new developments in conservation sciences and their relation to health systems; and to join the works in this project. *'Projects or scientific activities with international participation are also important in terms of improving ourselves and being useful to the world, so I want to participate in this project.'* WG 5 and 6.
 - The AC asked the MC advice on whether or not to accept this application, as the topic is not one that is currently covered by EuroWeb;
 - H. Lukesova (NO) suggests that the application should be accepted, because someone from a very different field could enrich the Action; K. Grömer (AT) seconded that position.
- 3) Ilija DANKOVIC - Institute of Archaeology - Serbia (RS). With PhD, she is interested in Roman provincial archaeology, primarily the research of all of the aspects of identity and status of women in Classical antiquity, reflected through material culture, and plans to focus on textile production, clothing, and visual identity on the Roman Frontier in Serbia in the future.
- 4) Carolina GALLARINI - University of East Anglia - United Kingdom (UK), PhD student in Anthropology. Her case study is Kanak culture, in Kanaky/New Caledonia. Studying Kanak collections in European museums, she developed a project on the European textiles present on some of these objects. Her purpose is to catalogue those European fabrics and generate new narratives on their object bibliographies.
- 5) Milica Marjanović - Institute of Archaeology - Serbia (RS). PhD student, archaeologist, pre-roman sites in Serbia, interested in everyday life, identity, and textile tools.
- 6) Jennifer Marks - Johns Hopkins University - United States (US), PhD Student in classics, interested in Minoan crafts, specifically metallurgy and textiles.

The approval of WG applications will be submitted to an e-vote due to the lack of quorum.

d) Budget status: summary from the Grant Holder.

It was agreed that EuroWeb events should be held in the first half of the GP, so that reprogramming of left-over funds can be done if necessary.

The Interwoven Societies Conference in Lübeck (DE) and the Vienna Digital Atlas Hackathon (AT) are already paid, and some money has been saved on these events regarding the planned budget.

There are some claims still not submitted from the Textiles and the Body workshop in Lisbon (PT), so the final expenditures are still to be calculated. In any case, the AC reminded the MC that it is almost impossible to predict travel costs at this time due to price fluctuations.

If there are leftovers after the expenditures from this workshop are calculated, other events can still be organized, or more grants can still be opened (SLIDE 4).

- e) Update from the COST Association (if representative is present)

3. Follow up and discussion on...

- a) Grant Awarding by the Action

- The AC reminded the MC Members that the Grant Awarding has been very active (see list of grants awarded on slide 5).
- The Grant Awarding Coordinator, Riina Rammo, reminded that there will likely be another call for DCG's, and that the call for VMG is currently open.

- b) Progress of each working group and on MoU Objectives, WG tasks, deliverables, and Goals for the current GP

- F. Meo reported on the WG4 activities, including recent conferences (Interwoven Societies, Textiles and War), and noted that there are no more conferences or Training Schools planned for the remainder of the Grant Period;
- The Vice-Chair, K. Grömer, reported on the Vienna Digital Atlas hackathon, noting that it was very useful and a success as far as data input into the atlas was concerned, and proposed that more should be organized;
 - As a follow-up, T. Stolčova (SK) asked how members can introduce data on the Atlas, and if this will only be possible during hackathons. Digital Atlas co-leader A. Iancu replied, noting that members can introduce data at any time, and that anyone interested in doing so has only to contact the Atlas team for instructions and support.
- L. Quillien reported on the WG3 activities, including the preparation of articles for the Anthology; the organization of the Textiles and the Body workshop; and the team's collective work on a platform for textile and dress terminologies. She noted that the goal this year is to share the list of terms in all languages prepared for the Atlas. She also announced that an online workshop is being prepared for the end of the GP, on "Lists and inventories of textiles from Ancient to Modern times". Finally, she noted that for the next period there is already a proposal by M. Korten to organize a Training School on wool and knitting.
- F. B. Gomes gave a brief presentation on the Textiles & Body workshop, organized in the framework of WGs 1, 2 and 3.

c) Reminder of the goals for this GP

- The AC reminded the MC and CG of the goals for the 3rd GP (slide 6).

4. Planning

a) Revision of Work and Budget Plan of the current GP:

- The AC commented on an adjustment to the budget plan for the current GP (slides 7-8). There was an idea by Marie-Louise Nosch, to weave and document a tapestry of the EuroWeb logo. The cartoon for this was prepared by U. Mokdad (and paid by the University of Warsaw), and the idea was to have it produced by a workshop in Serbia. It now seems that this will raise issues with COST and that the intended atelier is unable to produce the tapestry in time. While the production of this tapestry is not to be definitely cancelled, it is not realistic to expect it to be produced any time soon. It is therefore proposed that the funds allocated for this be reprogrammed and used for a great opportunity to film an upcoming event.
- It is therefore proposed that these funds are added to the Dissemination budget to film the Training School on hands-approach to textile tools at Malia, Crete (03-07/07/2023) – filmmaker: Hélène Michel-Béchet; costs – c. €1000 invoice (slide 8).
- There were no comments on this proposal, which will be submitted to an e-vote.

b) Draft plans for the following GP: overview of the already planned activities.

- Workshop or seminar on "Lists and inventories of textiles from Ancient to Modern times" – possibly on 09-10/10/23, online
 - K. Grömer asked for more information, L. Quillien gave further details on the activity – the goal is to reflect on the type of information to be gathered from these lists, and methodologies to study them; Call for Papers will be launched soon.
- Training School on "The European world of knitting, knitwear, and wool", to be held in Iceland in 2024. M. Korten presented the idea – one day on terminology (work on the terminology platform); one day with practical sessions; one day with presentations from participants.
- Training School on mineralized textiles (in Pompeii), co-organized by C. Margariti, L. Iancu and F. Colletti – no updated at this time.
- Concluding EuroWeb Conference in Warsaw in May 2024 – combined with NESAT – one day conference with summaries of the Action's activities.
- K. Sarri – proposed a workshop – "The Saffron Gatherers Workshop" – difficult to execute due to timing (must be in October – so either this year, or may be difficult to schedule).
- Workshop on sails and ship equipment – presented by F. Meo and S. Sabatini – two big maritime-related projects going on in SE (Gothenburg) – interested in collaborating with EuroWeb – contacts are still in process. K. Grömer expressed her support for this initiative.
- Proposals for events will be gathered during the budget preparation – there is a chance that the Action will get a top-up from COST to organize further events in the 4th Grant Period.

c) Upcoming activities

- Workshop on Traditional Textiles in Central and Eastern Europe – I. Petroviciu mentioned that Late August to mid-September is a realistic date, but that this needs to be run by F. Zaharia. The Call for Papers will be disseminated soon.
- Training School on microscopy using Dino-Lite, to be held online – will attempt to respond to the need for a manual and a standard methodological proposal.
- Training School in Malia – will cover the documentation of tools, discussions on functionality and use-wear analyses; will be held in July. M. E. Alberti added some words, noting that the TS will comprise a week of activities, including an introduction to techniques and tools and to petrographic analyses, as well as a practical portion (spinning and weaving with traditional tools). Participants will be housed at the Maison de Fouilles in Malia.

5. AOB

- The AC underscored the need to write and publish in order to achieve the goals set up in the MoU.
- She also emphasised the opportunity offered by the Open Research Europe platform and to compile proposals (one idea: a methodology paper on microscopy using Dino-Lite). A potentially good idea is to publish other manuals and methodological guides in ORE.
- K. Grömer asked whether publications just from AT team count. The AC underscored that EuroWeb needs to be acknowledged in all publications. K. Grömer suggested that a document be prepared with bullet points covering how make publications count for EuroWeb.

6. Summary of MC decisions

- N/A – as the MC Meeting has no quorum, the decisions will be made later by e-vote.

7. Closing

- Next proposed MC Meeting – Warsaw – online – 20th October 2023.
- No further comments from the MC members at this time.
- The AC thanked all the participants and closed the Meeting.

- 6) Increasing the budet of the hybrid MC Meeting in Bucharest, in order to allow more MC members participating in person: = 15,000 EUR

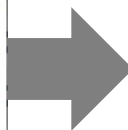

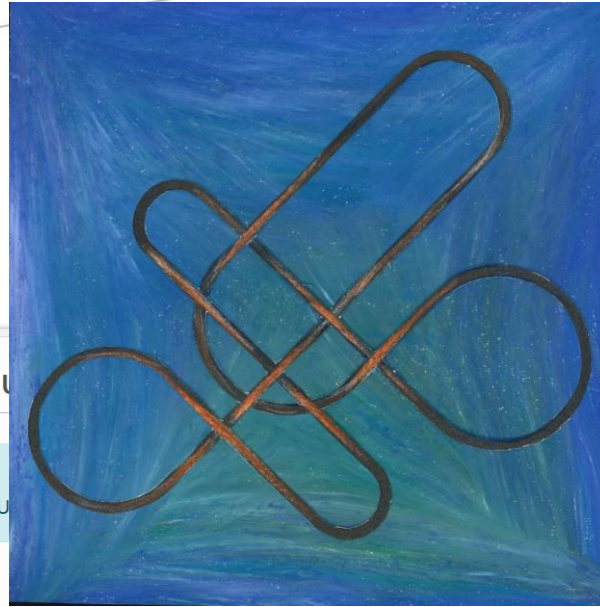
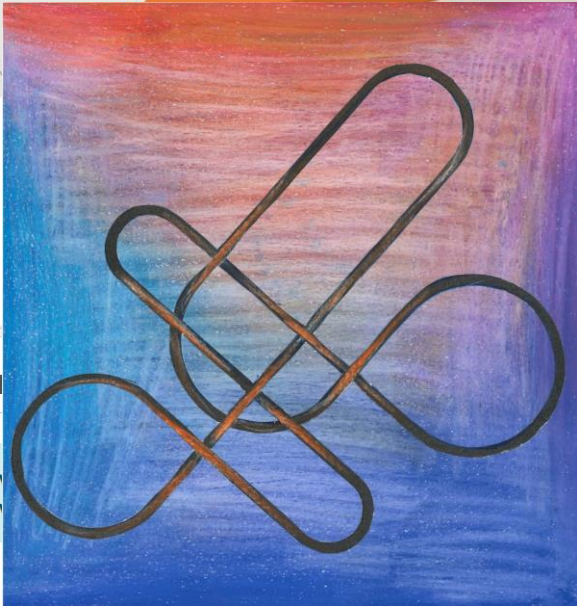
- 1) To bring together COST members with textile research communities and enhance their communication and collaboration. To initiate shared, collaborative research projects.
- 2) To engage scholars from several disciplines in the Humanities together with professions outside academia and co-create transdisciplinary results.
- 3) To benefit from the small but excellent research environments in ITCs and learn from their craft traditions, a unique European cultural heritage. Training of ECIs from ITC will promote this cultural heritage. Career workshops will target ECI from ITC.
- 4) Promote and mentor ECIs, especially from the ITCs, training and STSM. Target is 16 STSM and 25 training schools and workshops.
- 5) Co-create new tools for textile research: The interactive EuroWeb Digital Textile Atlas co-created by 20+ scholars, and 50+ specialised open access publications on textiles and dress.
- 6) Co-create a trans-European scheme, transfer of knowledge between universities, museums, design schools, and independent craftspeople, designers. Target by 2024: 250+ scholars and practitioners.

2022-2023



- 1) To focus on dissemination of the EuroWeb results via Open access text publications and the publication online of the current version of the Digital Atlas.
- 2) To strengthen multidisciplinary networking and to target it towards the EuroWeb objectives and deliverables through in-person meetings.
- 3) To develop further training schemes and workshop activities in order to promote and mentor young researchers and innovators and ITC participants.
- 4) To develop further schemes for communication of the EuroWeb results and communication with the EuroWeb stakeholders.
- 5) To continue monitoring, diagnosing and ensuring gender balance and inclusiveness among the EuroWeb members.
