1. Welcome to participants, verification of the quorum and adoption of agenda;

2. Information to the MC

a) Recap of the minutes of the last meeting, e-votes and matters arising since the last meeting

Action Chair, Agata Ulanowska [PL]: The last MC Meeting was hybrid and took place in Bucharest, Romania on May 19th, again with no quorum. Minutes are available on our website.

The MC decisions were validated by e-votes: for the delegated tasks by the Core Group (about the new members and participants eligible for reimbursement) and through e-COST voting. Additionally, we voted on reduced allowances for a series of events, and changes to the Working Budget Plan related to the implementation of grants in this Grant Period. For the detailed list of e-votes, see slide 2 of the Action Chair's presentation.

The Working Budget Plan for the final Grant Period has been accepted by the MC on 18/10/2023 and it is already approved by the COST and UW and it is available for spending (update from 25/10/2023).

b) Core Croup: report from the Core Group, including delegated decisions

Since the last MC meeting, the Core Group has accepted the list of reimbursed participants for the workshop at Baita and the new action participants, while the Grant Evaluation Committee under the leadership of Riina Rammo [ET] did a huge job with evaluating the grant proposals and then approving the grant reports. For the detailed information, see slides 4–8.

c) Progress of each working group and on MoU Objectives, WG tasks, deliverables, and Goals for the current GP

Action Chair reminded the MOU objectives and the 3rd Grant Period Goals –slide 3, and presented an overview of the events in the 3rd Grant period, including workshops, conferences, seminars and training schools – slides 4–5.

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Short reports from Working Group Leaders

WG 1 (Christina Margariti, EL) participated in both training schools (on Dino-Lite and textile tools at Malia).

There is ongoing work on the publication of the Purpureae Vestes Proceedings (upcoming in 2024) Another ongoing publication is the monographic volume of *Science Heritage*, with four articles by the EuroWeb members and two others expected in the next year. WG 1 has also submitted two contributions to the EuroWeb Anthology.

Plans: Training school on mineralised textiles (at Pompeii with the new date: 15.-19. April 2024 – organisers: Francesca Coletti, Liviu Iancu, and Christina Margariti)

WG 2 (Magda Woźniak, PL) contributed to the Anthology, co-organised a workshop in Lisbon, with participation of designers and a short session with a dance group – there will be a publication of this workshop.

WG 3 (Louise Quillen, FR) there was a recent workshop on textile inventories (from Antiquity to modern period), possibly to be concluded in publication.

Plans: a training school on wool and knitting (the main organizer is Meghan Korten, IS) in April 2024. They continue working on website for textile terminologies and textile functions.

WG 4 (Francesco Meo, IT) participated, organised and co-organised in many workshops and conferences (e.g. Textiles and War in Bucharest), now WG4 works on proceedings of two conferences and other publications. WG 4 co-organised training school in Maila and organised an online workshop on byssus in September 2023 (organisers: Felicitas Maeder and Francesco Meo)

Plans: Sailing Textiles conference in Goteborg in April 2024 (organiser: Serena Sabatini) and Influence of Asian Textiles on the European Cloth Industry conference.

WG 5 - the leader was not present

WG 6 (Francisco B. Gomes, PT) since 2022, we have the communication plan and a variety of social media is used to spread day to day activities, including specific communication undertakings, such as the EuroWeb Book Corner for presenting new books. There are new ideas: a series of podcasts on EuroWeb YT channel with young and senior scholars, and about interdisciplinary techniques. EuroWeb was present during the European Researchers Night at Lisbon (Francisco B. Gomes) in Archäologie am Berg 15-16. Sept 2023 (4000 participants), and Lange Nacht der Museen (Long Museums Night), at the Natural History Museum with 16,000 visitors, Karina Grömer).

Plans: WG 6 applied for the second edition of the New European Bauhaus in Brussels, additionally to the stand, there is an offer of a practical workshop on sustainability and circular economy.

The Digital Atlas of European Textile Heritage (Alina lancu, RO) hackathons were organised to get a new data input for the Digital Atlas, which had its official launch organised in Bucharest, in May. There was also a collaborative presentation discussing the Digital Atlas at the CIETA congress and other conferences.

Plans: more hackathons to be organised to fill in the gaps, inclusion of modern textiles, possibly coming due to a collaboration with the CIETA

d) Action Participation: WG membership and applications

Since the last MC meeting, the following members have been accepted:

Ashlian Ozturk (TR), Deniz Bayrak (TR), Kristina Andersen (NL), Maria Giovanna Campobasso (IT), Morten Grymer-Hansen (DK), Caglar Sivri (TR) and Vassiliki Nikolovieni (EL, slide 6). COST Association AISBL

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Furthermore, Florica Zaharia and Ana Urescu who are the EuroWeb members from the very beginning of the action (they were among the proposers), were approved officially by e-COST.

There is a series on new applicants (slide 7), due to the lack of quorum they will have to be accepted by the Core Group e-vote. With their approval, the number of formal members will result to 216.

Firdevs Mert Sivri (TR), WG 1,3, 5. Suleyman Demirel University, Faculty of Pharmacy.

Nicolas DELFERRIERE (FR), WG 2, 3, 4. Université Toulouse Jean Jaurès, a contract lecturer in ancient archaeology (Greek and Roman) at the University of Clermont Auvergne.

Raven Kiss (NL), WG 1, 4. Koninklijke Academie van Beeldende Kunsten. The fibre artist and educator with a keen interest in the historical uses of textiles.

Mustafa Karaman (TR), WG 1, 6. Konya Technical University. A full-time professor at the Chemical Engineering Department.

Sumesh Sasidharan (NL) 5, 6. Technical University of Eindhoven. Currently working as Senior research engineer at University College Dublin.

e) Grant Awarding by the Action

The summery of the Grant applications that have been awarded by the action and are now processed (in total 21 grants) is presented on slide 8. Agata Ulanowska thanked warmly Rinna Rammo (EE), the Grant Awarding Coordinator, for her commitment in processing and evaluating of all grants.

f) Budget status: summary of the GP3 budget from the Grant Holder.

The Action Chair summarised the Budget Working Plan and its realisation in the 3rd Grant Period – see slide 9. In November 2023, we will have to submit the financial report for GP 3 and the final invoices are under processing but the Grant Holder institution.

She highlighted many delays of planned publications and reminded the COST rules for reimbursement of publication costs. As a result, some of the publications that are not out in this Grant Period have been moved to the next Grant Period, but as a result the allocated amount was not spent this Grant Period.

Agata proposed that, considering the workloads required by shooting and editing a short film from the training school at Malia, directed by Hélène Michel-Béchet, we should accept Hélène Michel-Béchet's request for payment, resulting in total 2000 EUR. This idea was supported by Emanuela Alberti (IT). E-COST e-vote is currently running on this matter.

g) Update from the COST Association (if representative is present)

3. Planning

a) <u>Draft plans for the following GP 4</u>. (LAST YEAR OF THE ACTION!!!! The end is on 12th October 2024)

The new Working Budget Plan has just been accepted – slides 10–14. It includes meetings, training schools and dissemination products.

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Agata reminded that we promised in the Memorandum organising training/master classes in writing grant applications. These are not included in the WBP, since we envision them as online events, but we need to organise them in the last GP.

Agata has also announced the **EuroWeb concluding conference on 20–21 May 2024 in Warsaw**. She requested some support for organisation (all WG leaders would ideally be co-organisers (a)) and asked for proposals for the leading theme. The following suggestions were proposed:

Karina Grömer: "After EuroWeb – Further Perspectives" Angela Huang: "Focusing on Networking and Knowledge Transfer through Textiles?" Paula Nabais "After EuroWeb"

"*After EuroWeb*" was well received, together with the suggested shift from concluding the action to future perspectives...

b) Work and Budget Plan proposal for GP 4.

A. Ulanowska: The accepted Working Budget Plan (slides 11–14) is tough, although we have slightly exceeded the allocated amount. Still, we hope for a top-up budget, which can help publications, if More publications will be feasible in this final years, and for grants, which are at the moment very limited.

c) EuroWeb concluding publications

She highlighted the significance of publications for successful accomplishment of the Action. She also reminded that alongside the Dissemination products scheduled in the WBP (slide 14), we all can use Open Research Europe platform.

- To bring together COST members with textile research communities and enhance their communication and collaboration. To initiate shared, collaborative research projects.
- 2) To engage scholars from several disciplines in the Humanities together with professions outside academia and co-create transdisciplinary results.
- To benefit from the small but excellent research environments in ITCs and learn from their craft traditions, a unique European cultural heritage. Training of ECIs from ITC will promote this cultural heritage. Career workshops will target ECI from ITC.
- 4) Promote and mentor ECIs, especially from the ITCs, training and STSM. Target is 16 STSM and 25 training schools and workshops.
- 5) Co-create new tools for textile research: The interactive EuroWeb Digital Textile Atlas co-created by 20+ scholars, and 50+ specialised open access publications on textiles and dress.
- 6) Co-create a trans-European scheme, transfer of knowledge between universities, museums, design schools, and independent craftspeople, designers. Target by 2024: 250+ scholars and practitioners.

- To focus on dissemination of the EuroWeb results via Open access text publications and the publication online of the current version of the Digital Atlas.
- 2) To strengthen multidisciplinarity of networking and to target it towards the EuroWeb objectives and deliverables through in-person meetings.
- 3) To develop further training schemes and workshop activities in order to promote and mentor young researchers and innovators and ITC participants.
- 4) To develop further schemes for communication of the EuroWeb results and communication with the EuroWeb stakeholders.
- 5) To continue monitoring, diagnosing and ensuring gender balance and inclusiveness among the EuroWeb members.
