1. Welcome to participants, verification of the quorum and adoption of agenda; represented countires are marked in bold

Representatives from 21 countries attended the Meeting, with four participating online (HU, MT, NO, SE). A quorum was achieved, and MC decisions were made through in-person voting.

- 2. Information to the MC
  - a) Recap of the minutes of the last meeting, e-votes and matters arising since the last meeting
  - c) Action Participation: WG membership and applications, New MC Members/Observers and provisional substitution

Action Chair, Agata Ulanowska [PL]: The last MC Meeting was virtual and held from Warsaw on October 20<sup>th</sup> 2023, again without quorum. Minutes, available on our website, were accepted by e-vote.

- -The MC decisions were validated by e-votes (for the detailed list of e-votes, see slide 2 of the AC's presentation):
- -- The minutes from the previous Meeting were approved.
- --The explicit MC vote on the COST Innovators Grant (CIG) application was also approved. The application, a follow up grant of this COST Action, has been submitted and successfully passed the first round of qualifications. The hearing in Brussels is set for Friday, May 24<sup>th</sup>, 2024, and will be attended by the primary applicant, Francisco B. Gomes [PT].
- --The first vote for the top-up budget for the final Grant Period was also cast, but there will be a second vote as soon as all pending reimbursements are cleared from the budget. The AC asked the members to submit their reimbursement claims as soon as possible, since the top-up budget is to be implemented at the beginning of June.
- --Numerous WGs applications were approved as well (see slide 3).
- -The AC presented one new WG pending application from:

Mehmet ASIF ALAN – Bayburt University (TR) – for WG 1, 2, 3 – Specialising in business and marketing, textile and production management. He aims to contribute to the development of strategies for innovation and competitiveness in the textile industry. In addition, by expanding his network, he aims to strengthen international collaborations and have the opportunity to interact with important stakeholders in the textile

#### industry. COST Association AISBL

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The application has been approved by voting during Meeting.

-The AC then presented the many activities organized in the Fourth Grant Period (see slides 4 and 5). There were six events, which included two Digital Atlas hackathons, The Festival of the New European Bauhaus, and three conferences/workshops. These were the "Sailing Textiles" conference was held in Gothenburg on April 29<sup>th</sup>, the present EuroWeb concluding conference, and the forthcoming "Influence of Asian Textiles on the European Cloth Industry" to be held in Lisbon on June 6<sup>th</sup>. Additionally, there were three Training Schools: on natural dyeing (Porto, April 8<sup>th</sup>), on mineralized textiles (Pompei, April 15<sup>th</sup>), and on knitting (Reykjavik, May 6<sup>th</sup>).

-In this Grant Period there were 17 Grant applications (see slide 6), all have been evaluated. More applications will be approved after implementing a top-up budget.

- d) Budget status: summary from the Grant Holder.
- -The AC provided an update on the current budget status (see slide 7). The AC proposed transferring any remaining funds in the budget to Grants. This proposal was approved by vote during Meeting, indicating that any remaining budget money should be allocated to funding the Grants. The AC also discussed the top-up budget (see slide 8), which is scheduled to be implemented in June.
  - b) Core Croup: report from the Core Group, including delegated decisions

#### -Short reports from Working Group Leaders

**WG 1** (Christina Margariti, EL) – WG1 has gathered over 200 members. In 2021, WG1 organized an online workshop on "Advanced Analytical Techniques for Textiles", resulting in the publication of 13 articles. In 2022, a hybrid workshop titled "Archaeology and Archaeometry of Ancient Textiles: analytical methods, conservation, and dissemination in textile research" was held in Rome. In October 2022, in Athens, WG1 organized the "VIII Purpureae Vestes International Symposium" in collaboration with ARTEX, and its proceedings are currently being prepared for publication. WG1 has also prepared or coorganized several Training Schools: on the Analysis, First Aid and Documentation of Excavated Textiles (CTR, Copenhagen, August 2022); on the Use of Dino-Lite-Type Digital Microscopes for Textile Analysis (online Mini-Training School, Warsaw, June 2023); on handling, studying and documenting mineralized textiles (Pompeii, April 2024); "The European World of Knitting, Knitwear, and Wool" (Reykjavik, May 2024). Additionally, representatives from at least eight countries are preparing two contributions for the Anthology. An upcoming project, TEXTaiLES Horizon, is set to start on September 1st, 2024, as a result of the collaborative network.

**WG 2** (Magda Woźniak, PL) – WG2 has successfully met its targets for workshops and training schools and has also contributed to the Anthology. Members have delivered over 10 conference papers and 17 Anthology papers, co-authored by more than 15 authors from 36 different countries.

**WG 3** (Louise Quillen, FR) – WG3 has proposed and co-organized the following Training Schools: "The European World of Knitting, Knitwear, and Wool" and on textile and clothing terminologies.

**WG 4** (Francesco Meo, IT) – although the Leader was not present for the presentation, the AC praised the group's work. Many of the presented events were co-organized by WG4. The AC also mentioned the collaboration initiated by F. Meo with Tessitura GIAQUINTO, an Italian textile factory, to produce textiles based on ancient technology and design.

WG 5 (Riina Rammo, EE) - no report, data available on the slides 6 and and 11.

**WG 6** (Francisco B. Gomes, PT) – the Leader presented the communication efforts. EuroWeb has been particularly active on social media platforms. There is substantial material available on our YouTube channel, including a short documentary on the Malia workshop titled "Hands-on Approach to Textile Tools: Documentation, Functionality, and Use-Wear. Textile Tools from Bronze Age Malia, Crete as a

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Case Study" directed by Hélène Michel-Béchet, released in July 2023. Another achievement is the inaugural edition of the EuroWeb Conversations podcast. EuroWeb also made a notable impact at the 2024 Festival of the New European Bauhaus. F.B. Gomes encouraged members to submit new content for use on our communication platforms to further support the network.

The Digital Atlas of European Textile Heritage (Catarina Costeira, PT & Alina Iancu, RO) – The team has organized three hackathons (in Vienna, Granada, and Tartu), which enabled the addition of a substantial amount of data to the database. Future goals include further development of the DA and how to continue feeding it with data. Future objectives include further developing the DA and determining methods to continuously input data into it. The AC has affirmed that the University of Warsaw will continue to support and maintain the DA. Tereza Štolcová [SK] inquired about the presence of textile-related artifacts spanning the extensive timeframe covered by the DA (i.e., from the 7th millennium BC to the 2nd century AD) and asked about areas within the DA lacking artifacts. The AC assured that all periods within the DA's timeframe are represented by some material, and that the empty spaces do not imply absence of material, but rather indicate that EuroWeb does not yet have access to it.

**EuroWeb Anthology** (Louise Quillien, FR) – the team is currently working on the publication of the Anthology, scheduled to be released before September 2024.

- -The AC subsequently commended the EuroWeb members for achieving the MuO objectives and actively pursuing all the goals outlined for the Fourth Grant Period (see slide 9). Concerning point 3 of the Fourth Grant Period Goals, the AC has agreed that offering online training would be beneficial for early career researchers. The AC also expressed satisfaction with the progress of individual publications and meeting this goal within the expected timeframe.
  - 3. Follow up and discussion on the progress of each working group and on MoU Objectives, WG tasks, deliverables, and Goals for the current GP
- -The AC then proceeded to discuss the current status of EuroWeb (see slide 10), emphasizing that the EuroWeb involves 32 countries with a total of 250 members. Among them, 36% are young researchers and innovators, 21% are males, and 5% are from outside academia. The limited participation of non-academics is due to financial constraints, which currently do not qualify them for reimbursement.
- -Karina Grömer [AT] inquired about meeting the publication quota before the project concludes and whether articles/monographs currently in the publication process would be eligible. The AC clarified that only publications accompanied by a URL address, indicating online availability (e.g., on Academia or ResearchGate, as well as other dissemination platforms like Polish Archeowieści), can be included in the report. Since EuroWeb lacks a repository or database, materials cannot be stored within the network otherwise as links to the EuroWeb Google Drive. The AC emphasized that all publications must also include an acknowledgment of funding from the Action.
- -The AC then provided statistics on the meetings organized, training schools, and grants (for details, refer to slide 11).
- The AC also reviewed the current status and budget for dissemination and EuroWeb publications (see slide 12). Given the anticipated surplus in the original budget, the AC proposed a 200 EUR increase in the Anthology budget. This decision was approved by vote during the Meeting.






